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Agriculture Volunteers in demand throughout the globe

Every day most of the world’s population goes to work in an agriculture-related job. The developing world’s survival depends on adequate amounts of food production, a daunting task considering recent statistics provided by the United Nations Food and Agriculture Organization: each year around 815 million people suffer from hunger and malnutrition, and 55 percent of the annual 12 million child deaths are attributed to malnutrition.

Peace Corps Volunteers are hard at work in 70-plus nations combating one of the causes of hunger listed by the U.N.: inefficient agriculture practices. “Volunteers teach farmers better farming techniques such as crop rotation, erosion control, irrigation and soil fertility,” said Dana Ravelojaona, Peace Corps recruitment coordinator. “Best of all, these techniques are environmentally sound and ‘bio-intensive’ which means they maximize the production of crops in a limited area or growing season.”

The Southwest Regional Recruitment Office received a request of 120 Agriculture Volunteers for 2004, an increase from last year. The American southwest has provided great numbers of Agriculture Volunteers. Top campuses which have supplied numerous alumni to this sector are the University

of Texas, Texas A&M University, New Mexico State University, Hendrix College and Oklahoma State University. In May 2003, Peace Corps Volunteer Amanda Jo Dickson of Ponca City, Okla., graduated from OSU. The

agriculture economics major departed on Sept. 29 to Paraguay to work in a crop extension program.

“I expect to learn a lot from my Peace Corps experience. My degree is in agriculture economics, but my assignment deals with soil management, crop diversification and pest control, of which I know basics about,” said Dickson who believes her assignment will greatly diversify her skills in agriculture which will lead to better job offers in the future. “When I’m helping the farm families make decisions, I’m going to be

able to tell them about the benefits to their soil. I’m also going to be able to show them how it’s going to affect them economically.”

Dickson is one of 10 OSU alumni currently serving. Several recent OSU Agriculture Volunteers were motivated to join by a lecturer on campus who served as an Agriculture Volunteer in Ecuador from 1962 to 1964, Dr. Billie Chambers. “During my 14 years at OSU, I was often invited to lecture in various classes, primarily in the College of

News Briefs

■ Peace Corps enters its 137th nation:

The nation of Azerbaijan received its first group of Peace Corps Volunteers on Oct. 1. The 30 trainees will train for assignments as secondary school instructors and teacher trainers. The nation is located on the western coast of the Caspian Sea. Azerbaijan was the first Soviet republic to declare independence in 1991. Although the official language is Azerbaijani, most of its 8.1 million population speak Russian.

■ NMSU becomes latest Peace Corps Fellows/USA program school:

On Oct. 6, the Peace Corps and New Mexico State University in Las Cruces signed a memorandum of agreement allowing former Volunteers to receive reduced-cost graduate education in exchange for internships. Fellows will work toward a degree in public health, nursing or social work through NMSU's College of Health and Social Services. For more information, call Program Director Daryl T. ■ Peace Corps reenters Albania:

In September, 32 trainees arrived in Albania, marking Peace Corps' return to the eastern European nation after a six year absence. Most of the Volunteers will work as Business Volunteers, helping in municipal governments and community organizations. From 1992 through 1997, 156 Volunteers served in Albania, working in the areas of secondary English teaching, small business development, and agroforestry development. More Volunteers whose work will concentrate on the areas of education and health are slated to arrive in 2004.

■ Two recruiters join Dallas office:

This fall, the Southwest Regional Recruitment Office welcomed two new recruiters, Judy Frey and Annaliese Limb. Frey, from the Chicago area, served as an Education Volunteer in China, 2001 to 2003. Limb, of Dallas/Fort Worth, served as a Health Volunteer in Cote d'Ivoire, 2000 to 2002. ♦

Agriculture: More Volunteers needed in 2004

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Agriculture. When I spoke with classes, I always tried to work in the Peace Corps," said Chambers, who recently retired from her position as an associate professor of agriculture education, communications and 4-H. "I like to tell students that by living and working in another culture, I not only made new friends but gained a new perspective on the world and an appreciation of differences."

During her assignment, Chambers traveled to different communities in Ecuador, teaching human and animal nutrition and sanitation. She also developed 4-H and gardening clubs in schools.

Chambers recommends the Peace Corps to anyone who wants a two-year adventure, plus the opportunity to help others help themselves. The Agriculture Volunteer assignment allows anyone with the proper skills and background to serve in the Peace Corps, with or without a degree. The Peace Corps has four agriculture areas to serve in:

- **Applied Agriculture Science:** The Volunteer helps rural families produce, use, store and sell the food they need by increasing agricultural productivity, improving nutrition awareness, and organizing income generation activities. For this position, one needs the following:
 - A. bachelor's degree in agronomy, horticulture or other agriculture discipline;
 - B. three years full-time farm experience;
 - C. a bachelor's degree in any discipline with 18 months full-time farm experience;
 - D. a bachelor's degree in botany or entomology with six months of practical experience growing vegetables or fruit or working in a nursery;
 - E. a bachelor of science degree in biology, including 15 semester/22 quarter hours in an agricultural science, botany, or entomology, with six months of practical experience growing vegetables or fruit or working in a nursery.
- **Farm Management/Agribusiness:** The Volunteer will help communities achieve

greater food security and increase earning potential by working with government agencies, development agencies, local farmers and business organizations. For this position, one needs the following:

- A. a bachelor's degree in agriculture economics;
- B. three years experience in farm management and/or agribusiness;
- C. a bachelor's degree combining agriculture and management, including agribusiness, agriculture management, farm management;
- D. a bachelor's degree in any business or economics discipline with one year experience in farming or agribusiness.

• **Animal Husbandry:** The Volunteer will work directly with small farmers, micro-entrepreneurs and local cooperative groups increasing the production of cattle, goats, pigs, poultry or small animals for home consumption or sale. The Volunteer may also work with herd health, range management or dairy farming. For this position, one needs the following:

- A. a bachelor or associates degree in science in the fields of animal science, animal husbandry or poultry science;
- B. three consecutive years of farm experience working with livestock;
- C. a bachelor's degree in any discipline with 18 months of farm experience working with livestock.

• **Agriculture and Forestry Extension:** The Volunteer works in collaboration with farmers, women, youth groups, schools, non profits, government or agriculture extensionists in the areas of: field crop production; community, home, and school gardens; community forestry; food storage and preservation; marketing; or fisheries. For this position, one needs the following:

- A. a bachelor's degree in any discipline with a minimum of three months experience in vegetable gardening, nursery work/management, tree planting, tree care, urban forestry, livestock care/management, or fish (fresh or marine) cultivation/production;
- B. one year experience in vegetable gardening, nursery work/management, tree planting, tree care, urban forestry, livestock care/management, or fish (fresh or marine) cultivation/production. ♦
